• Nursing programs have additional requirements to apply. These requirements can vary from program to program. Be sure to carefully review the application requirements for any program you want to apply to. Some additional requirements can include the following (this is not a complete list of all possible requirements). Visit the program website for more detailed information.

- Completion of a Pre-Admission Exam (PAX Exam), or the Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS). Some programs require a specific PAX Exam or TEAS Test score. Visit the program website for more detailed information. - An active, unencumbered Washington State Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN) License.

- A background check performed by the Washington State Patrol and with a "No Record On File" report with the Department of Social and Health Services. (All nursing students are required to complete a background check. The background check is usually completed through the nursing program you are applying to.) - American Heart Association CPR for the Health Care Provider. This includes adult, child, and infant, under the guidelines of the American Heart Association. Online CPR courses are not accepted. - Students can be required to carry personal health/medical insurance throughout their clinical rotations. • College-level skills in English and math (eligibility for courses numbered 100 or higher) are required before registering for the tocomplete additional prerequisite coursework if they do not yet qualify to register for these college level courses.

Schools Highlighted in Blue have DTA/MRP program options. (Direct Transfer Agreement/Major Related Program) Programs in a blue box offer Direct Transfer Agreements (DTA). Completion of the DTA/MRP program will satisfy requirements for direct transfer with only one additional year of study to complete the Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) degree at four-year institutions in Washington State. • A transcript evaluation process for all courses taken at another institution must be completed by the program being applied to. • This spreadsheet does not guarantee a prerequisite course taken at one institution will be accepted at another institution.
