

Serious Mental Illness: BY THE NUMBERS



People with untreated serious mental illness are 16 times more likely to be killed during a law enforcement encounter than other civilians.

In 44 states, a jail or prison holds

more mentally ill individuals than the largest remaining state psychiatric hospital

Individuals with schizophrenia and bipolar disorder are 10 times more likely to be in a jail or prison than a hospital bed

1 in 4 fatal law enforcement encounters involves an individual with serious mental illness.

(3.3% of the population) adults with schizophrenia or bipolar disorder mental illness
